Two years ago, a church congregant gave Pastor David Livergood a brochure for the Carla Hardy WV Project CommuniTree program. David loves nature and trees, so he was very interested in learning more.

After seeing what was involved, the Martinsburg Seventh-Day Adventist Church decided to pursue their very first community tree planting project this fall.

They currently maintain over ten acres of mowed grass. Their dream was to plant more trees for people to enjoy their site, connect with nature, and protect the environment.

On planting day, Sunday,

November 11, we engaged 46 volunteers, including 17 youth and 29 adults.

After getting the ice and water
out of the holes, Zach Norris
from Cacapon Institute led a

It was great to see all working together. Thanks to all of the volunteers, we were able to finish the project in just a few hours. Good job, team!
